

The Story

Detroit, 1976. A former auto worker hides the pain of his son's suicide, while grappling with another failed relationship and barely scraping by to make ends meet. His only respite is the local bar owned by a survivor of the '67 riots.



Amidst a union strike that puts their jobs on the line, three young veterans try to come to grips with their friend's death while facing their own internal struggles - a new father with a family to support, a gambler with a crippling debt, and a gentle soul being destroyed by PTSD nightmares.





The four men drown in silent grief until they gather to watch the final Ali-Norton title bout. In an apartment too small for their collective anguish, their unchecked emotions are as unrestrained as punch after punch thrown in the ring. Regrets unfold, challenges are confronted, and shared experiences form unbreakable bonds, providing the strength and hope they need to rise again no matter how hard they're knocked down.






Winston Jones




Feeling cheated at work and still reeling from the suicide of his friend, Winston wants justice. He claims his anger gives him his spirit, but it also gives him trouble. A Vietnam vet, married and with his first child on the way, he wants a better life for his family than the one he was dealt.

Lenny Munk

A gambling man and by all accounts a chump. Lenny is consistently in over his head, even when given a break. He's quick to take the easy way and place blame elsewhere if it goes awry. He was on the production line at Ford with the other guys, but when Freeman got the boot, he was promoted to shift supervisor... a position for which he's not qualified.








Plagued with nightmares since returning from Vietnam, Cecil got a job at Ford thanks to Freeman. He keeps a low profile, earning his pay and asking for nothing more. He retreats from confrontation with the mindset that if a problem isn't acknowledged, it doesn't exist.

Queenie



The tumultuous impact of the '67 Detroit riots always in the back of her mind, Queenie took over ownership of a neighborhood bar to keep business in the area. Unattached and unavailable, she keeps to herself, but is also fiercely loyal to her regulars so outsiders better respect when they step through her front door. Think Angela Davis as a bar owner that people turn to for advice, empathy and tough love.



Dot

Freeman's ex-wife has canned beer class but champagne taste. If you called her a diva, she'd take it as a compliment. Shacked up with another man, she did once love Freeman but now she just pities him. She feels bad about the death of a stepson she didn't know very well but "life goes on."

Mrs. Jeffers

Freeman's upstairs neighbor lives for soap operas and game shows, and one can find her most days in that room-hogging La-Z-Boy recliner; the one big exception being Sundays. That's her day of rest and she spends her time with the ladies at Church.



Social Impact

The wage gap widens. Racism and sexism run rampant. Vets return home with PTSD. Labor force tensions reach a dangerous tipping point. Political relations are on the brink of collapse.

These themes are as relevant today as they were almost 40 years ago when the stage play Rounds premiered. The feature film **Detroit Rounds** is an opportunity to expand the audience beyond the boundaries of a stage and to harness the power of storytelling to create social change. Detroit Rounds will amplify the voices that need to be heard and present the faces that need to be seen, both in front of and behind the camera.


